

Play56 Backgammon

[Play56](#) runs in the top of the chart of the most frequent spelling mistake or typing error when looking for the online backgammon room Play56. Sorry, Play65. Search engines know how to deal with more obvious typos (such as plai65, backgamon, bakgammon, etc); but when backgammon fans absentmindedly type play56 and then press on the search button, they might get lost, find themselves staring at creepy Child Rag Doll Costumes or going through a catalogue of rare vinyl records. Hopefully, this article will shorten your way to the world's largest online backgammon website.

Play56 or Play65?

If you are an experienced backgammon player, searching for Play56 must have been a typo. The 6-5 roll is one of the most desirable opening rolls in the game of backgammon. And since in backgammon lingo the larger number always comes before the smaller number (for example: 6/5, 4/2, etc), you just can't go wrong but by mistake.

But if you are new to backgammon, let me tell you how to play 65:

If you were lucky enough to roll 6-5 on your opening roll, you would have a single move you can play: you move the checker residing on your 24-point and move it forward, 11 points to the 13-point, also known as the midpoint. This opening roll and its favored reply is often called "lover's leap", try to image why.

To summarize, once you are deep into backgammon, remembering the correct order of things (play 65 instead of play56) should be very easy. Yet even if you are a backgammon beginner or you type so fast that the letters and digits gets scabbled, we will try to direct you to the right place – [Play56 backgammon](#) site, of course.
